I live in Thrapston with my husband and we have adopted 3 children all with complex additional needs.




My name is Karina Kelly-Smith and I am a Parent Governor and the current Vice Chair of the Teaching & Learning Sub-Committee.


Hi, my name is Mike Santoro. I am a co-opted governor, the current Vice Chair as well as being Chair of the Teaching & Learning Sub-Committee.
