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I am basing my answers on the fact that there was no learning support from March 2020 to the end of school year in July 2020 during the first lockdown. I was doing the best I could working from encyclopedias etc at home. I had no help supporting him with any curriculum based work and I did not know what it was. no direct teaching or contact with his class teacher took place with the exception of two pre recorded stories towards the end of the school year.

When my child was home learning from October 2020 the support was poor with just a hello at the start and end of day in circle time, no learning was being provided. I raised concerns with Mrs Morris and on line sessions at 10am and 11.30 am maths and English were started as well as hello and goodbye sessions at the start and end of day. This was a vast improvement. When school was closed and teachers were at home Amy continued to provide one to one sessions at 10 and 11.30 which worked well. However, this was changed in March 2021 when the rest of the children went back to school. My child could not return to school as we are sheilding. Mon Tue and Wed on paper learning is well structured. The Thur and Fri on paper learning can be informal and lacks structure and substance. I appreciate the children need some unstructured learning time but this does not work well for home learning and I am conscious he is so behind with his school work.

The quality of Amy's weekly planning and handouts and worksheets and the one to one we have is very good, it is interesting and set at about the right level. However, the one to one learning from March 2021 was reduced to one session a day for 30 mins. I am told there is not an LSA allocated to Dec while he is at home and it was not possible for him to join in the maths class at 11.30 which was disappointing. It is known that Dec does not work independantly and needs adult support to access learning. I also found that his SALT was left with no support until FEB 2021, after almost a year without it being delivered.

I hope this is helpful feedback, I am sorry if it is negative in part, but this is the reality of what we have experienced during what has been a very difficult time for everybody.

My child benefitted from face to face learning only, which is teacher agreed. his teacher has always been easy to reach, and the above answers are in no way a bad reflection of her. it's simply just not remote learning for our child, it's impossible to remote learn at this age in general for neurotypical children let alone ones with Autism. during the first lock down we had zero support for 6 months, which causes untold problems we can't reverse however the most recent lockdown was shorter and a teacher was available however there wasn't much she can do remotely. it was more of a hello, a story or song then a bye. thank you.
