Bananas Class

Bananas class have been busy exploring the topics 'What's the weather like today?' and 'Nursery Rhymes'. We focused on different themes each week, including 'Arctic Animals', 'Winter Warmers', 'Five Currant Buns' and 'Wind the bobbin up'.



We have enjoyed exploring sensory luff trays and tabletop display relating to our themes. These have included ice and snow, paint, shaving foam and dry materials such as cereal and rice. We have used different tools to mark make within the media and manipulated tools, such as scoops and utensils, for different purposes.



We have shared many stories, taking turns to engage with sensory props and communication aids such as switches. These stories included 'Crow in the Snow' and 'Ten in a Sled'. We even enjoyed the snow fall at school and made marks in the snow using our bodies. We also made icy nature decorations, leaving them outside overnight to freeze.



We have enjoyed lots of practical activities involving number, shape and space. We've explored posting amounts of snowballs down ramps and feeding Mr Penguin different shapes and numerals. We have also explored measure in cooking, as well as filling and emptying containers in water play and practicing our fine motor skills with threading.



We have experienced lots of different nursery rhymes, engaging with each other to join in with actions, move our bodies to the music or change the rhyme using symbols and props. We have also had lots of fun being imaginative and creative, particularly in the role play area exploring the bakery and farm shop. We also enjoyed celebrating Chinese New Year and Pancake Day!

Apricots class

We have had lots of fun during our Winter topic, taking part in lots of practical activities which we have all enjoyed.

In maths we have explored number, shape and measure. We have experienced filling and emptying containers using ice, snow and water and used the large balance scales. We have explored themed playdough, using shaped cutters and manipulating it with our hands. Some of us have been sorting different animals into two groups and we have also been exploring the temperature of different materials and liquids.



In literacy we have listened to many themed stories such as, 'The Gruffalo's Child', 'One Snowy Night' and '10 on a sled'. We are still continuing our mark making in different materials such as icing sugar, cornflour and snow cloud dough. We have also been using chalk, pens and paint to create marks too. We love our weekly dough disco sessions and these have been helping us build our hand strength for mark making.



We have had lots of fun during our art and design sessions. We've painted with ice, painted on snow, created pictures with wellington boots and paint, we built an igloo for the arctic animals and made icicles. There have been lots of fun tuff tray exploration activities set up which we have taken part in too, we especially loved when it snowed and we brought some of it in to paint! Weekly music sessions have been lots of fun, practicing stopping and starting using instruments and we have taken part in lots of sunshine circle sessions.



When it snowed we all went straight outside to play in the snow. We made snowmen, spray painted the snow and ran around- it was great! We have also made wind streamers to play with outside when it's windy.



Apples Class



Apples have been enjoying being at school and have enjoyed having the whole class back together. We have continued to work on our number recognition and counting. We been practicing our listening skills by matching the animal sounds.



Our topic has been 'Are eggs alive?'. This is proving to be very interesting and the children have enjoyed the variety of creative lessons attached to it. Apples are working very well together and should be very proud of themselves.



Lemons Class

It has certainly been an interesting term with a combination of remote learning and more recently everyone back into school. It was fantastic to welcome everyone back! With the weather improving and the daylight hours increasing this spring term seems to have gone so fast for Lemons Class!

Our topic for this term has meant we have had the chance to look at many different aspects of 'Remembering When We Were Small'. We have really enjoyed looking at how we have changed since we were a baby and what we now enjoy such as our favourite foods.



In Maths there has been so much progress - becoming more confident when working with numbers and shapes and using these in so many different areas of the subject.



Another area of excellent progress this term has been in writing where letter formation and understanding of letter sounds and reading has excelled.



We have had an 'interesting' term and all the children have achieved so much and adapted fantastically to the changing environment. Well Done Lemons Class!

Oranges Class

We have had lots of fun upon returning to Oranges Class recently! We have been working hard on developing our Maths and English skills, including practising our phonics skills and learning about new sounds, exploring poetry and non-fiction books and measuring weight.



We have also had fun developing our communication and interaction skills in drama and have enjoyed games such as 'Hairy Fred', mimicking emotions and making different sounds and body percussion.



As part of our theme for learning 'Are Eggs Alive?' we have been learning about different types of animals that lay eggs. We also did some 'eggciting' investigations and had lots of fun with our own 'egg drop', whereby we tested parachutes we had made for our own egg characters.



Pineapples Spring newsletter

So much has happened since our last newsletter but at last there is a light at the end of the tunnel. All of Pineapples children worked so hard during the latest lockdown. The children working from home embraced the experience and made the staff very proud in well they all adapted. We had some really fun sessions so a big thank you to all the parents that made that happen. 😊 The children working at school also adapted well, working without their peers....and now we are back together again.

It has been a busy term. We have been looking at the topics of "Do you remember being small?" and "Are eggs alive?" The topics made us think about when we were babies and our latest topic has focused on life cycles of plants and animals. In our English work we have been looking at rhyming stories, stories with familiar settings, non-fiction and we celebrated World book day. In Maths we have looked at measuring, number and capacity. We have all loved the water tray!

At the end of our memories topic we had a Pirate themed day. This was a whole day of fun dressing up as pirates, going on treasure hunts, decorating treasure chests and making treasure maps.

World book day was another themed day that we have enjoyed recently, dressing up as characters and sharing our favourite books together.

We have continued with our weekly interaction sessions, both online and in school. We have all joined in with group cooking, Tac Pac, sunshine circle and story massage sessions. There has also been some lovely dance/action song sessions and a lot of smiley faces.



Limes Spring



We have had a challenging start to the new year with learning at home and attending online circle times. We are immensely proud of the way the children have adapted to the changes and how you as parents have been so incredibly supportive of everything we have put in place to bring education and learning to the children in Limes Class. The best day has to have been when everyone was finally welcomed back to school and the children smiled and greeted their friends and familiar adults. The children have continued to flourish and learn through these ever-changing times and have embraced learning opportunities this term to include....

Our Superhero topic has involved us sailing around the sea with Ellen MacArthur visiting Antarctica, making animals from this region, South America, creating forests and the little town of Falmouth, Cornwall where we waved flags we made. Along the way we met Paralympians with Super Sport Hero Powers including Mari Akhurst, dressage, Tanni Grey-Thompson, cycling and Rosie Reed, dog sports the children thought of things to find out about them and used their voices and switches to ask questions.



In Science we explored electricity and forces. We used torches which we found out needed batteries to work, to light up items we were trying to find and we tried using different forces to move objects. This included pushing toy vehicles across different surfaces to experience friction and cooking using forces as we kneaded, poked and stirred our ingredients.

We considered our physical health in PSHE and have been finding ways to keep fit and healthy through exercise and movement, noticing our heart beat, pulse and the changes on our body as we move.



We explored images on the computer and tablets during computing lessons and explored places around the world by manipulating a mouse and tool bar to find countries and things of interest to us.



During English lessons we have followed instructions to create Superhero backpacks, Superhero arm cuffs and to bake cakes. We have also explored dictionaries to find out what things are listed in alphabetical order and found some new and unusual items and words. We continue to practise reading our school reading books and learning our phonics.

This term we practised our number skills by adding and subtracting items, recognising and using money in our class shop and exploring 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. We have continued to practice our recognition of numbers, considered time through daily routines and experiences and used



measures to weigh items, decide which is the biggest or smallest and through measuring liquids including water and milk for our baking.

We have used our outdoor space to take part in PE lessons to practise striking and fielding games, our ability to control bats, sticks and balls has developed well. We have also used dance and dance routines during our PE time indoors and outside.

RE involved us thinking about Why Muhammad is important to Muslims? We looked at different artefacts, buildings and explored song, verse and prayer. We celebrated Mothering Sunday with a card and gift for our Mummy's and we are looking at festivals we celebrate at Spring time and the Easter Story.

The science topic has been 'Animals and Living Things/Evolution and Inheritance' We have enjoyed looking at different animals and how they survive. We also learnt how to better look after the environment and that animals can die out or become extinct sometimes.

In Computing we have all been getting very good at teams. We have enjoyed playing maths games and have been learning how to take images in class.



Our PE lessons happened both using our 'Five a day' and some of our play sessions.



We have had lots of great



Numeracy learning. We have practised our counting and calculations. We have learnt more about 2d and 3d shapes. We have also covered money and time for the first time this year.



In English we have had a range of stories set in rainforests. We have also studied the stories of other cultures, such as 'Rainforest Explorers' and 'Wombat Stew'. These stories are with a message and moral.

The children and staff in Grapes have worked very hard and we have all had to get used to working in different ways. Thank you for the excellent support from parents especially if your child has been home learning.

In creative curriculum, our theme has been superheroes and the children loved creating their own Arctic environment.

Peaches class

This term we have done lots of learning at school and some children have been engaged in remote learning.

In Science we have been learning all about evolution and inheritance. The children have explored how animals have adapted to their environment such as the Arctic and The Rainforest. We have looked at nocturnal and diurnal animals and how litter and pollution can affect their habitat. The children really enjoyed making fossils when learning about extinct animals and using role-play and stories to understand why some animals are endangered.

Our topic this term has been Rainforests and we have learnt about what a rainforest looks like, what animals live there and what foods originate there. The children have built their own rainforest display over the weeks, using collage, printing, model making and computer skills. They made rainforest cookies, baskets and headdresses that would be worn by tribes' people.

Our RE topic has looked at inspirational individuals and the children particularly enjoyed finding out about Stephen Hawking, Mother Theresa and Stephen Wilshire. They did some fantastic art work and wrote reasons why they thought they were special.

In PSHE we have talked about getting on and falling out. The children have thought about what makes them feel angry and what they can do to make themselves feel better.

In Maths we have completed lots of practical number activities, measuring using objects such as cubes and a ruler and work on money and time. In English we have read lots of stories linked to our topic work of rainforests and also our science topic. The children have been developing their phonic and comprehension skills and doing lots of practice with their handwriting.

In computing everyone enjoyed learning about programming Bee Bots and using remote control cars.

Our class topic this term has been Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and you can see the children have been busy turning the classroom into a sweet shop, through Art and D.T. lessons.

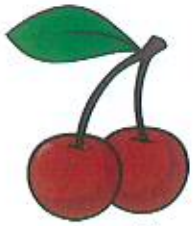

Maths and English remain at the forefront of our curriculum and the children have explored length, mass and capacity as well as data collection this term. We have enjoyed looking at different types of writing and continued with our phonics and kinetic letter programmes.



Although this has been a term to remember, the children have adapted wonderfully and worked so very hard. It was only fair we were allowed a couple of snow days! We hope for a more consistent summer term where we have lots of fun and engaging curriculum activities for the children to dive into.

Our theme this term has been Potions and Spells and we have been focusing on the Roald Dahl stories: Many children were home learning when we read *George's Marvelous Medicine*, so they had lots of fun making potions at home. We read *The Twits*, which some of the children thought was a very strange story but the Roly Poly Bird and Muggle-Wump the monkey were the favourite characters.

In conjunction with our Science theme of materials we learnt about different buildings, including Victorian school and houses, and finding out about the Great Fire of London where hundreds of wooden houses were burnt down.

In Science we have been making different mixtures and potions. A highlight was investigating what happens to an egg when it is cooked for different amounts of time, or if you change the chemical structure of an egg shell by soaking it in vinegar! The children have been very good at using scientific vocabulary about solids, liquids and gases.

Since half term we have been visiting different places around the world, such as China, Africa and the Arctic. We enjoyed Performance Poem about Chinese New Year, and made African drums, and got very creative painting, colouring or making collages of different African animals.

We have enjoyed a weekly walk around Spencer Park, and doing 5 a day with the pupils who have been still at home. We are glad that everyone is back now, and hope that it will be the start of a 'new normal' that we have all been hoping for. The children have coped really well with the uncertainties of this term, and it has given us the opportunity to talk about our emotions and how we respond to those feelings appropriately. Those at home have learnt an impressive amount of life skills, walked more with their families and can communicate better at home!

Well done to all the boys who have engaged with online and/or classroom learning, and thank you again to the parents who have supported them through this tricky term.

This term, Bananas class have had a lot of fun exploring the topic 'What's your favourite nursery rhyme?' Each week we have focused on a different theme, such as: Hickory dickory dock, Baa baa black sheep, 5 currant buns in a baker's shop, I'm a little teapot, and finally, Humpty Dumpty.

This term, it's been a real pleasure watching the children express their preferences and interests and continue to develop their friendships as they seek out each other to share their experiences. The children have also enjoyed welcoming our new staff member, Dorrie to the class. Dorrie will be working in Bananas class on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.



They have really enjoyed playing alongside and with each other particularly with small world toys and in the continuous provision area which has been set up to reflect our theme of the week.

Our weekly Sensory, Sunshine Circle and Mindfulness sessions also promote developing friendships further whilst introducing the children to new and fun experiences!



In maths, we've participated in a variety of activities relating to number and shape, space, and measures. We've had the opportunity to sort objects into groups, join in with number rhymes and finger games, fill and empty containers, assemble simple

arrangements and constructions and exchange a coin for goods in the class shop.



In phonics, we are continuing to learn a new letter sound each week from the Read Write Inc set 1 speed sounds and use these for sound-blending practice. The children have really enjoyed our daily small group interactive sessions, particularly rhythm and rhyme activities and environmental and instrumental sound activities. The children continue to enjoy sharing their letter sound of the week objects brought in from home.

We have been very busy developing both our fine and gross motor skills. In our weekly PE sessions, we are developing our balancing, throwing, and catching skills and have enjoyed playing a range of group games such as Cat & Mouse.

Our weekly play dough disco sessions continue to support hand and finger strength, enabling us to engage in Kinetic Letters activities to develop our handwriting skills. We are all making great progress with our mark making/writing skills and demonstrate increasing control in holding and using mark-making tools and imitating drawing shapes such as circles and lines and some recognisable letters.



Our weekly cooking sessions are always lots of fun. To support our weekly themes, we've created edible mice, enjoyed afternoon tea, and made chocolate crispy sheep. These sessions provide us with the opportunity to engage and participate with weighing and measuring and then sampling our tasty treats! Bananas class have also enjoyed a

range of sensory activities based on tactile and malleable materials, such as making play dough buns and using teapots, not only with paint to explore mixing colour, but also with teabags to make their own tea!

The Bananas class team have been so proud of the children this term and we look forward to welcoming the children back for term 5, refreshed and ready to explore our new topic 'Why do ladybirds have spots'? Happy Easter to you all.
