


We have had a wonderful term and all the children have achieved so much, Well Done Apples Class!

This term we have been learning about materials and carried out lots of investigations with different materials and foods; melting ice and chocolate was good fun and a bit messy!




During Maths and English we have continued to develop our counting, understanding of shapes, letter recognition, phonics and writing/communication skills.




We have also been learning about Christmas around the world. Which is celebrated in many different ways with a range of traditions.

We have enjoyed a wide range of activities - here children are making music, making playdough and visiting a local children's shoe shop.



Our theme this term has been Boots and Shoes. We have had some lovely trips to Rushden Town Centre to explore what shops are on the High Street, and we found lots of shops that sell shoes and some that mend them. We also enjoyed a trip to the Northampton Museum and explored their excellent interactive displays, and practiced using money in the gift shop.

We have printed with shoes, made clay shoes, made North American moccasins and we have enjoyed sewing so much, that the boys have begun to design their own Christmas decorations to be made out of felt.

In Computing, we have enjoyed making our own art on the computer, making a montage and exploring making pictograms and bar charts.

We have enjoyed practicing our reading, writing, speaking and listening through Traditional stories such as the Elves and the Shoemaker, Alice in Wonderland and the Hare and the Tortoise. We have also explored some of Julia Donaldson's stories such as 'The Scarecrow's Wedding'.

In Science we have learnt about Light, shadows and explored Scientific words such as transparent, translucent and opaque as well as reflection and refraction. We have also learnt about the dangers and uses of electricity as well as how to replace batteries and making an electrical circuit.

In Maths we have been practicing problem solving skills, using a number line to add and subtract and exploring and describing shapes.

This has been an excellent term, and all the class have made good progress and we have had lots of fun doing so.






Bananas-T Newsletter

This term, Bananas class have had a lot of fun exploring the topic 'Do you have a favourite teddy'? We have enjoyed learning all about teddy bears and real bears, focusing on a different theme each week, including my teddy bear, bears and their habitats, bears in stories, going on a teddy bear hunt and teddy bears picnic. We have also celebrated the season of winter and traditions/festivals, such as Bonfire night, Remembrance Sunday and Christmas.

Our cake stall for Children in Need was a great success...



and the children have really enjoyed taking part in the 'Daily Mile' and visiting parks in our local community.



It's been a real pleasure watching the children settle and build relationships with the adults that help them daily; clearly thriving in a structured environment. The children have really enjoyed playing alongside and with each other in the continuous provision area which has been set up as a 'home' to promote role play and interaction, and also in the outside area, particularly with



the large Polydron, wooden planks, mud kitchen, and trikes.

Our weekly Sunshine Circle sessions on a Monday afternoon and Mindfulness sessions on a Thursday afternoon, led by Zoe also promote developing friendships further. We have also celebrated 3 birthdays this term.



In maths, we have participated in a variety of activities relating to numbers and shape, space, and measure. We have had the opportunity to explore 2D shapes, sort objects by colour and size (using a range of natural materials) and positional language (using small world toys and play equipment/natural materials). We have also designed and built 3D structures engaging with a variety of media, using our large wooden construction sets in both the indoor and outside play areas. The children have also participated in a wide range of



number songs using props.



In phonics, we are learning a new letter sound each week and some children are beginning to blend and segment these sounds to read and spell words. The children have enjoyed our daily sessions, particularly our 'Kids TV123



phonics song', shaker bottles and sharing with the class their sound of the week objects brought in from home. Some children are beginning to match some of the objects on their phonics communication boards to initial letter sounds as they participate in activities such as I spy with my little eye. In connection with our weekly themes, we have also enjoyed listening to



the following books: *Peace at Last*, *Goldilocks*, *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*, and *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, what do you see?*

We have been busy developing both our fine and gross motor skills in our weekly PE, finger gym and dough disco sessions.



Developing our hand and finger strength enables us to engage in Kinetic Letters activities to develop our handwriting skills. We have been doing this in different tactile materials and have particularly enjoyed exploring the writing stones! We also use our magic



wands to participate in big air writing and have also experienced using a wipe board. We are making good progress with our mark making/writing skills.



Bananas class have also enjoyed a range of art and design activities. We have encountered and engaged with Transient art and have even designed new slippers for Mrs Bear and a mobile for Baby Bear.



Our weekly cooking sessions have been lots of fun too! So far, we have made Pudsey bear biscuits, bear paw cookies and shortbread.

These sessions provide us with the opportunity to engage and participate with weighing and measuring and the opportunity to use child-safe cutlery to cut up a range of ingredients. The best part is then sampling our tasty treats!



The Bananas class team have been so proud of the children this term, it has been a long and busy term for them and they have all managed brilliantly, particularly with 2 separate periods of remote learning. We look forward to welcoming the children back in the New Year and we wish you all a wonderful two week break. We look forward to hearing all about it. Apples class have had fun this term exploring their new environment at school and learning through play. We have enjoyed lots of different fun activities outside too.

We have enjoyed lots of practical activities involving number, shape and space.

We've explored measuring our feet, emptying, filling and stacking shoe boxes and experienced very big/very small with Goldilocks. We experienced measure in cooking and enjoyed using our senses to explore ingredients.

We also had lots of fun being imaginative and creative, particularly in the role play area exploring the shoe shop.



We have also enjoyed activities celebrating bonfire night, Diwali and Halloween!

In




English we have been covering stories from a range of cultures, myths and legends, captions and labels and lists.

Grapes Newsletter : Half Term Two



This term has been all about zoos and animals in Grapes. First, we looked at the old Wellingborough zoo and compared it to London Zoo. We made our own zoo enclosure with a range of construction materials and also designed a zoo map. We made and decorated a wide range of animals for our class zoo display. We also looked at new artists and copied their techniques. We zoomed in using 'Google Earth' and looked at maps of London zoo and went on an interactive tour. We have enjoyed listened to zoo songs and singing along and using a range of instruments to play along. We then inventing our own moves and dance for the songs.





In RE the first topic was 'The Creation Story'. We enjoyed our weekly Creation song and learnt about the story of creation. Then in term two we looked at how different religious festivals are celebrated creating many varied art pieces. We covered a range of festivals and experienced some of the special experiences associated with these celebrations.





In PHSCE the topics have been 'Healthy Eating' and we tried lots of new foods and helped make fruit salad. In second term we looked at our own

abilities through a variety of different activities to teach us new skills.

The science topics has been 'Animals and Humans Growing and Moving'



We have found out about nutrition and what a human body needs. We also looked at the human body parts and the major organs inside a human body. We then looked at the digestive system and how it is involved in taking our food and drink and using it to provide energy, growth and other important functions within the body and then disposing of unwanted waste. We had a great time tracing around each other and labelling our body parts.

In ICT we have looked at how we keep safe online and using the ipads and computers. We then used the

computer to find save and label pictures and information from the internet. This term we have been taking, printing and adding captions to photographs. We have used clicker 8 and PicCollage to help organise our images.

We have had weekly PE lessons with our coach Juliette in both gymnastics and group games including bench ball.

We have had some invasion games, relays and gymnastics


sessions in class also. We have managed to get in three morning walks a week, which we all enjoy.

This term we have done lots of learning both at school and at home.

In Science and Topic, we have been learning all about Space and the solar system.
