

Rowan Gate Primary School Sport Premium 2016 – 2017

The Sport Premium Funding that is received by Rowan Gate Primary School is allocated to the salary (in part) to the P.E. Coordinator who is responsible for the planning and delivery of P.E. and Sport at Rowan Gate West (Wellingborough) and Rowan Gate East (Rushden).

From January 2016 the school appointed an additional Sports Coach in order to ensure equality of provision across both sites, the Sports Premium funding contributes to the salary of the additional Sports Coach.

The P.E. Coordinators time during the week is currently allocated as in the table below:

P.E. Lessons.	53%	£4,658	The PE coordinator and Sports Coach to work alongside class teachers to promote good practice and model coaching/teaching skills.	All KS2 classes had 1 PE lesson delivered by a PE coach and one by the class teacher. Positive snapshot observations and increased attainment evidenced in B squared data illustrate the benefits of this approach.
Intervention (1 to 1 P.E. Lessons)	9%	£790	Targeted pupils receive 1:1 PE sessions in order to raise self-esteem and promote understanding of the positive effects of healthy exercise.	Pupils developed firm relationships with staff during these sessions and began to develop an understanding of strategies to better manage their behaviour.

Intervention (Get Moving Club).	4%	£352	To provide less confident children the opportunity to enjoy the benefits of an active lifestyle in a group activity.	Children who were less likely to opt to join a lunchtime club were encouraged to become involved through invitation and carefully planned activities/peer group.
Lunchtime Sports Clubs.	10%	£879	To timetable more lunchtime clubs.	Improved levels of behaviour on the playgrounds. Increased levels of physical activity across the school. Registers are kept to ensure that PE coaches were targeting a wide range of pupils.
Change 4 Life Clubs.	5%	£440	To use current P.E. and club attendance data; liaise with school nurse, family liaison and Healthy Child leader to help indicate which pupils should attend C4L. Organise a C4L Club improving physical health and self-esteem	Identified pupils consistently attended C4L club and they became more active whilst at school – P.E. and playground.

After School Club.	4%	£352	To offer more out of schools hours activities at RGW and RGE; 6 to 10 pupils sign-up to attend an after school club.	In liaison with Northampton Town FC, there is an after school football club running on each site, offering pupils the chance to engage in physical activities for health and leisure. Links with the wider sporting community are developed with pupils and parents.
Gifted & Talented Provision.	4%	£352	To develop the skills of our more able pupils by exploring integration opportunities with local schools and encouraging participation in a wide range of sports through competitions/activities offered within the SSP.	Identified pupils integrate with local schools. Children have developed skills in new sports- Tri-Golf for example. Pupils experienced physical activities alongside mainstream peers.

Planning (all of the above plus competitions, festivals, fixtures)	11%	£967	1. To create a 'sports crew' through Young Leader training. 2. Young Leader training was delivered in liaison with SSP and a sports crew was established on each site. They supported Sports Day events and playtime activities.
